The Pupil Premium is additional funding for publicly funded schools in England to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and close the gap between them and their peers. It is allocated to children from low-income families who are currently known to be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) in both mainstream and non-mainstream settings, Looked after Children, children adopted from care and Service Forces children. It also includes pupils who have been eligible for FSM at any point in the last six years (known as the Ever 6 FSM measure).

Schools are free to spend the Pupil Premium as they see fit. However, we are held accountable as to how we have used the additional funding to support these pupils and are also required to publish this information online. This will ensure that parents and others are made fully aware of the attainment of pupils covered by the Premium and the extra support that they receive.

At UAK the Pupil Premium strategy for 2017-18 will be monitored and measured internally by the member of the senior leadership team responsible for Pupil Premium. The strategy will be quality assured by a link member of the Governing body.

The school has received £240,325 and intends to use in the following way:

- Development of Accelerated reader and effective use of the library by the English team.
- Introduction of ERIC (Everyone Reads in Community Time) in Community time.
- Development of success in arithmetic scheme.
- Additional capacity allows for team teaching, smaller groups (extra set in English and Maths).
- Specific bids by each department to support the progress of PP students within their curriculum or pastoral area.
- Work of pastoral team to work with students to pre-empt issues.
- Development of bespoke intervention programmes for small groups of students / 1-2-1. These will help to intervene and develop students resilience
- To ensure all students are able to focus on learning we ensure that we remove the barriers to learning including equipment, learning resources.
- Programme of opportunities for different groups of students to raise aspirations and broaden horizons including visit to university
- Challenges and rewards for groups of students to target and improve their attendance.
- Provide all students with a Chromebook which ensures they have a device which will enable them to access learning beyond the classroom, work from home, complete homework and revisions.
- Intervention manager provides support for KS4 students after school.
- All students visited at their primary school before the end of year 6, with a clear picture of their context and their performance data.
- Full contextual data on each child by shared with all staff before the end of the year with training built in to process the information
