Year 9	<p><b>University of Bradford STEM Experience Day</b></p> <p>Our sponsor The University of Bradford and UAK's Computing Faculty host a STEM experience day for all year 9 students. Learners experience university facilities and interactive sessions e.g. coding and games design, enabling them to make links between their GCSE choices and progression onto HE and employment. Year 9	<p><b>Trinity Kitchen Challenge</b></p> <p>Pupils are given the opportunity to hone their business and enterprise skills with a unique challenge from Leeds' Trinity Kitchen – the pop-up street food space at Trinity Leeds shopping centre. The students were asked to create their own pop-up food concept to feature at Trinity Kitchen and had to pitch their big ideas to a panel of 'dragons'. Year 9	<p><b>National Literacy Trust Words for Work</b></p> <p>The programme is designed for 30 Key Stage 3 girls to work with local business volunteers in their school and aims to demonstrate the importance of literacy for success in employment by providing workplace context for students. Year 10	<b>Ahead Partnership - Interview Assessment Day</b> Business volunteers from Airedale Enterprise Services, Northcliffe Mortgages, Rotherwood Recruitment, UK Asset Resolution and Craven College were among the professionals who gave Year 10 learners their first taste of a real interview in April. Pupils spent the day practicing their interview skills with each student taking part in a one-to-one session with a role model from the business world. Questions were focused around their future ambitions, achieving qualifications and how their skills might make them invaluable to employers. Year 10	<b>The White Room - Digital Advantage Work Experience</b> Over 5 days, students attend a Pop-up Digital Agency and deliver an industry-designed programme of creative thinking, business ideation and modeling, branding, tech and business development.
