Year 7	<p><b>Employer Speed Networking</b></p> <p>A fun and interactive carousel session for pupils to find out about the world of work and also to challenge assumptions. This develops learners' questioning skills and builds confidence, with exposure to volunteers from local employers; including: Ministry of Justice, Walker Morris Law, Kier Group, Aireworth Vets, Fives Landis Lund.</p>	2, 5
Years 7, 8 and 9	<p><b>Assembly Future Goals in association with West Yorkshire Combined Authority</b></p> <p>Together with UAK's Enterprise Advisor and other local employers, pupils will receive information on up-to-date local careers and labour market opportunities.</p>	2
Year 8	<p><b>Inspire to Succeed partnership with YABA - Business Entrepreneurship</b></p> <p>Yorkshire Asian Business Association has teamed up with Global Diversity Positive Action to deliver an innovative programme designed to inspire and raise the children's aspirations. This week long programme has been designed so that the children work in groups on an enterprising idea or invention. In addition, external speakers and business ambassadors will share their knowledge to assist the project. An additional 15 students will work over one term on the production of 3 short films, a selection of support roles will also be on offer to remaining students eg. actors, performers, props and costume artists etc.</p>	3, 6
Year 9	<p><b>The Brilliant Club - The Scholars Programme</b></p> <p>The Scholars Programme employs doctoral and post-doctoral researchers on a part-time basis to deliver programmes of academic enrichment to small groups of pupils. Through a combination of university trips, in-school tutorials and online resources, it supports pupils to develop the knowledge, skills and ambition needed to progress to highly-selective universities.</p>	1, 7

Year 10	<p><b>1:1 Interview Assessment Day</b></p> <p>Business volunteers from Fives Landis Lund, Airedale Enterprise Services, Northcliffe Mortgages, Rotherwood Recruitment, UK Asset Resolution, University of Bradford and Craven College were among the professionals who gave Year 10 learners their first taste of a real interview in April. Questions are focused around their future ambitions, achieving qualifications and how their skills might make them invaluable to employers. Students will gain an insight into a local modern working mill, an iconic British luxury brand and global market.
